CYCLE THREE (3)

The National Arts Council of Namibia (NACN) is thrilled to announce the successful applicants for the 2023, Cycle Three (3) grants disbursement period. Following a meticulous selection process, a total of fifty-one (51) projects have been approved for funding, securing a combined grant of N\$1,046,051.35.

We understand the challenges artists face, particularly in times of limited funding and resources. In response to this, the NACN is proud to continuing the approach to grant disbursement, providing recipients with quarterly instalments to ensure a steady income flow throughout their project.

We recognize the invaluable role artists play in shaping our culture and society. Our new disbursement approach aims to address the financial challenges faced by artists, allowing them to manage their resources effectively. The NACN funds projects across a spectrum of disciplines, including Craft, Dance, Literature, Multidiscipline, Music, Theatre, and Visual Arts. As we celebrate the diversity and richness of Namibia's artistic landscape, the NACN encourages prospective applicants to explore funding opportunities.

To be eligible for funding, applicants had to align their projects with at least one of the following critical focus areas:

- 1. Social protection and research.
- 2. Unearthing marginalized and indigenous arts in rural areas.
- 3. Addressing social ills such as unemployment and gender-based violence.

- 4. Supporting the involvement of women, youth employment opportunities, and people living with disabilities.
- 5. Creation of new works through digital media.
- 6. Capacity building and arts entrepreneurship.

This strategic focus underscores the NACN's commitment to fostering a diverse and inclusive artistic environment that actively engages with and addresses societal challenges.

Reflecting on the growth and passion witnessed in the 2023 grant cycles, the NACN notes a remarkable evolution. In Cycle 1, a grant amount of N\$167,232.75 supported eight (8) artists, constituting 9% of the expenditure in that quarter. Cycle 2 witnessed an expansion of financial support, with N\$589,561 distributed among 19 recipients, constituting 33% of the budget in the second quarter.

The introduction of advocacy sessions and a refined application process in Cycle 3 signifies a renewed commitment. With a proposed grant amount of N\$1,046,051.35 and 51 proposed recipients, this chapter marks a turning point, dedicating an impressive 58% of the budget to the sector in the third quarter. This disbursement underscores the NACN's unwavering belief in the transformative power of creativity and aligns with our flagship initiative.

The NACN remains steadfast in its role of influencing and enabling the creation of platforms that foster a conducive environment for creative practitioners to thrive. As we embark on this exciting journey with Cycle 3 awardees, we look forward to witnessing the profound impact their projects will have on Namibia's artistic landscape.
